In Class School Presentations

Each program runs during the block before recess, after recess or after lunch unless it is a full day program.

School Ecology Tour (SET):

A unique fieldtrip for Grades 3-7. Students learn hands on about the watershed, salmon life cycle, pollution, aquatic life, forest and stream ecology, as well as wildlife biology. Students participate in a point source pollution experiment, a walk near the school or on the school grounds to look at local plants, an aquatic insect study in the spring or a salmon dissection in the fall. Available fall and spring.

In Class School Presentations

A Bugs Life: (Spring Only)

Compare the lifecycle of a bee and a butterfly.
Includes caterpillars for you to raise and a live
observation hive to examine, learn the importance
of pollinators. Pre K - Grade 3

Fantastic Frogs:

We will talk about the differences between frogs and toads and the frog life cycle, created specifically to meet the learning outcomes of students Pre K - 1.5 hrs Grade 2.

Trees of Life:

By the end of the presentation, students will be able to identify 5 different kinds of trees and learn the importance of wildlife trees to the animals in our area. Made for Grades 1 - 3

Scales and Tales:

The children will go on a journey as they watch the salmon change and transition. Made specifically for Pre K - Grade 3, and can be adapted for Gr. 4 - 12

Can include a fish dissection in the fall for Gr. 5 - 12

Creepy Crawlies: (Spring Only)

The children will identify many different types of aquatic invertebrates, and learn the reason why it is so important to find such a great diversity in our streams. Suitable for Grades 3 - 12

Habitat Programs:

Build bird nest boxes, bird feeders, bat boxes and many more with kits that are easy to assemble.

Workshop includes a short presentation on corresponding animal and step by step building instructions as a class. Grades 2+

OWLES: Owls, Wild Life and Endangered Species

Dissect an owl pellet, reconstruct its skeleton, look at the owl food chain.

Fishbowl discussion: what happens if we disturb or disrupt an owls food chain: how does this explain why species become endangered? Endangered species of the Fraser Valley presentation.
